The successful candidate will be required to teach music across the PYP and MYP programmes to students with a diverse range of interests and abilities. Key responsibilities will include overseeing curriculum development, mentoring staff, and fostering a collaborative learning environment. The candidate will also plan and deliver an engaging inquiry-based curriculum, assess student progress through various methods, and tailor instruction to meet individual needs. Additionally, the candidate will contribute to extracurricular activities and excursions to support a well-rounded education.

About the School

Established in 1992, International School Nadi is an independent, coeducational, non-profit school for students aged 3-18 years. As an International Baccalaureate (IB) Continuum School, our accredited IB Primary Years, Middle Years and Diploma programmes aim to develop our students into resilient, empathetic and inquisitive individuals who think critically and creatively, with the courage and conviction to take positive action locally and globally. Our diverse community of approximately 250 students and 37 teaching staff represents 25 different nationalities. As an open admissions school, we pride ourselves on creating a nurturing, balanced and inclusive learning environment where each student is empowered to reach their full potential. Our teachers work with classes ranging from 8-24 students in a supportive and collaborative environment where staff wellbeing, autonomy and professional growth are valued.

The school campus is located in Nadi, the tourism hub of the Fiji Islands. Although a small community, Nadi provides a range of opportunities for short island vacations along with activities like hiking, water sports and zip lining.

- Inspires a strong sense of trust and confidence among students, parents and colleagues through consistent support, encouragement, and reliability.
- Ability to adapt to changing circumstances and navigate uncertainty with flexibility, resilience and a sense of humour.
- Exceptional organisational skills and the ability to manage multiple priorities effectively.

- A lifelong love of learning and enthusiasm for ongoing personal and professional growth.
